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InGenesis moves past office fire into new San Antonio headquarters,
bringing 150 people with it

SAN ANTONIO (October 14, 2015) The fire that broke out in InGenesis Inc.'s former building may have left the healthcare staffing agency temporarily office-less, but with plans to move into its new headquarters next month, it has done little to slow the company down.

In fact, it has arguably sped the company up.

The San Antonio-based firm has been one of the fastest growing companies in the United States over the past eight years, and is set to move into its new 34,000-square-foot headquarters at 10231 Kotzebue St. with plans to move 150 jobs. The company has 2,800 employees nationwide.

Gizmo LLC, an entity of InGenesis, purchased the industrial flex site this past April. The space has since been under construction to repurpose it for the firm's operations. The property, which spans nearly 3.5 acres, was previously a Toshiba (NYSE: TOSBF) distribution center, and the county currently has it appraised as worth more than \$2.9 million.

Prior to unexpectedly having to move out of its offices in the Blanco Plaza building, InGenesis was already outgrowing its space. However, when the property at 6609 Blanco Road suffered significant smoke damage, the company was forced to hit the fast-forward button on the move.

After working out of a hotel in the immediate aftermath of the fire, the University of the Incarnate Word offered InGenesis CEO and founder Veronica Edwards office space on campus that was previously occupied by Rackspace (NYSE: RAX).

Edwards has a close relationship with the university, where she earned her master of business administration and is pursuing a doctorate of business administration. She is also a UIW trustee.

The temporary set-up gave InGenesis the ability to continue operations as usual, without any service interruptions or client inconveniences. Edwards said that the arrangement allowed "our operations to not skip a single beat."

However, that doesn't mean that the firm isn't ready for its own mailbox again.

The new facility will more than double the firm's operational capacity, lending the growing company a platform for continued growth not just in San Antonio, but across the country.

InGenesis posted a compound revenue increase of nearly 133 percent between 2013 and 2014, rising to \$120 million last year.
